

Monuments of India

A monument is a type of structure or object that is created to commemorate a person, event, or idea. Monuments are typically large and prominent, serving as a symbol of remembrance and significance. They are often found in public spaces, such as parks or city squares and can be made of various materials such as stone, metal or concrete. Monuments can take many forms, including statues, obelisks, memorials and plaques.



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
It changes color depending on the time of day, it appears pinkish in the morning, milky white in the evening, and golden at night under moonlight. The four minarets surrounding it are slightly tilted outwards to prevent them from collapsing onto the main tomb in case of an earthquake.

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
It's walls are made of red sandstone, giving it its distinctive color and name. Inside the fort, there is a marble balcony known as the "Diwan-e-Khas" where the emperor would address the public and hold private meetings.

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It is a magnificent tower located in Delhi, India. It was built in the early 13th century by Qutb-ud-din Aibak, the founder of the Delhi Sultanate. The tower is constructed of red sandstone and marble. It is an iconic symbol of Delhi's rich history and architectural heritage.

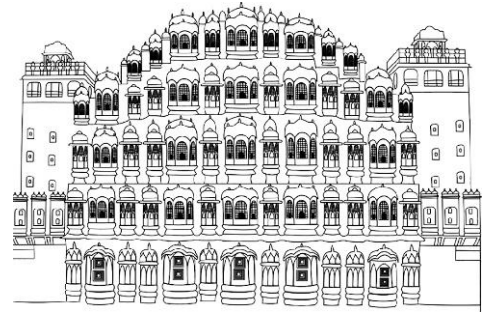
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It was not built by Indian architects but by British architects in 1924 to commemorate the visit of King George V and Queen Mary to Bombay (Mumbai). Ironically, the last of the British troops to leave India passed through the Gateway of India in a ceremony marking the end of British rule in 1948.

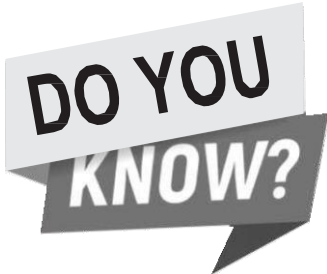
